I believe you can find much of information at our website, at [www.eci-ca.org](http://www.eci-ca.org). We know that we cannot answer all the possible questions by our website alone, so we are happy to write or call to answer any of your additional questions. Our application is also online. Besides the summer programs, ECI offers programs for J-1 and F-1 visa students. The following is information not included on the website but will assist you in making your decision about choosing the most appropriate program and school.

During the regular school year, ECI acts as the guardian and sponsor for F-1 international students attending private and public schools in California. For our dormitory students, we take them off campus each weekend and do a variety of community activities. There is no additional charge for these weekend activities. ECI pays all fees for the weekend activities.

ECI leases Monterey Bay Academy during the summer. All students participating in our summer program will have an American roommate (a MBA student) or another international student as a roommate, the purpose being to facilitate English language acquisition.

Monterey Bay Academy is a Seventh Day Adventist college preparatory high school, with nearly 100 percent of their students going on to college. ECI has no affiliation with the Seventh Day Adventist church, but all students attending our program must follow the rules of the school, such as no alcohol, smoking or drugs or face immediate expulsion. MBA gives no second warning. There are a total of five dorm parents working in the dormitory along with ECI staff to provide 24 hour-a-day supervision. There is also a nurse on the school campus that is available 24 hours-a-day.

MBA is located on 380 acres of land surrounded by strawberry fields with one mile of its own private beach. It has a student body of about 300 students. What makes Monterey Bay Academy unique is that all teachers and staff live on the campus creating a safe, friendly and family like environment. The MBA cafeteria provides a **vegetarian menu for all students**. We know this is a concern to students and family so each weekend and twice during the week we take students on off-campus activities. Many of the students use this time to purchase meat or other food items not found on the campus.

From June 16th to August 8th we expect to have approximately 80 students attending all ECI programs. We feel the greatest difference between our program and other similar programs is the amount of caring supervision we provide our students. Since all of our students are under the age of eighteen, we are very protective of their health and safety. Students can only leave the campus when ECI or MBA staff accompanies the them. Students are not allowed to ride public transportation without our approval. This is strictly for their safety. Nearly all of our students are academic tract students, so are highly motivated to study. The largest difficulty for students has been leaving. Most feel they have participated in a program that produced results, was fun, and are leaving with a sense of family and new friends.

## SUMMER INTENSIVE ENGLISH LANGUAGE PROGRAM

**Target Goal:** To dramatically improve students' English proficiency in speaking, listening, writing and reading so students can successfully be mainstreamed in to regular academic classes.

**Description:** Each summer Educational Consortium Institute (ECI) offers an 8-week summer intensive program for the serious student wanting to make dramatic progress in their English proficiency. ECI uses the institutional TOEFL test as the pre and post instrument to measure improvement. It is not unusual for students to make 60-100 points growth on the TOEFL during the summer program. The test is offered three times during the summer.

**The Weekend:** In addition to the strong academic program, ECI provides weekend trips and activities every Saturday and Sunday of the summer program to enrich the educational experience. ECI takes students to national and state parks, such as Yosemite National Park and Nisene Marks Redwood Park. In addition students have trips to San Francisco, Stanford University, Silicon Valley and the many parks, museums, theaters and many other attractions that the area has to offer.

**Conversation Partners:** Each day students meet with local high school students to participate in a variety of activities that introduce them to American culture and give them an opportunity to improve their oral fluency and practice the skills they have learned in the classroom. The program has proven so successful in preparing students for all academic classes, that Monterey Bay Academy strongly recommends all prospective international student applicants enroll in the summer intensive before the start of the regular school year.

This guide is to help you during your stay at Monterey Bay Academy. It is our true desire that you have a wonderful experience, meet new friends, become a fluent English speaker and have a lot of fun. We want to be sure you understand the rules and guidelines of MBA, and ECI, so we are getting together with you to review them. We want to give the opportunity to ask questions so you do not accidentally make a mistake that will not allow you to stay at MBA.

1. **Don't be late!** Be on time. You need to be on time everywhere we go! You must attend all classes unless you are sick and have permission to be absent by checking in with the Dean on duty and/or contacting an ECI staff. Please do not call ECI staff after 9:30 p.m. unless it is an emergency!
2. **Speak ENGLISH on campus.** The more English you speak, the more fluent you will become. All the international students want to learn English. If you speak in your native language, it slows everyone's progress.
3. **Have fun!** Get involved in school activities – but keep your studies and homework current! The more involved you are and the more you seek out opportunities to speak English, the faster you will progress in your U.S. education.  
  
Some of you may become homesick or have a problem or concern during your stay. This is normal. If you are unhappy about something, talk to us before calling home.
4. **ALWAYS KEEP YOUR ROOM LOCKED.** Keep your room locked and your key with you at all times. If you have cash or valuables (PC, phone card, jewelry – anything of value to you - , you may place them with the Deans or with ECI. Every year someone loses something valuable because they did not keep their door locked. ECI will keep your passport and I-20 if you wish.
5. **Room Key:** Every student will receive a key to their room, with a key lanyard. If you lose your key, you will be charged \$65 for a new key as they will have to replace the entire lock. If you lock yourself out of your room, the Deans can let you back in for \$5.
6. **Use of drugs, alcohol, or any banned substance will result in immediate expulsion from the school and could ultimately result in the loss of your visa status.**

7. **Please keep your rooms as clean** as possible each day. Make your bed every morning before you go to class. You will be responsible for cleaning your room. There are vacuum cleaners available at the Dean's Office. There is a substantial charge if your room is NOT left clean before home leave or at the end of the school year. It is your responsibility to leave your room the way you found it – clean, garbage collected and removed, bedding folded on the bed (ECI will have it laundered). **DO NOT WAIT** until the last day to clean your room. ECI staff and the Deans will make periodic checks of the rooms.
8. **Food in the dorm:** You may keep snacks in your room, but to avoid rodents or bugs coming in to the dorm, all food must be kept in covered and tightly sealed plastic containers. No cooking or hotplates in the rooms – please use the dorm kitchen. However, no cooking of meat of any kind in the dorm kitchen. **DO NOT** bring cafeteria food into the dorm.
9. **Study Courtesy:** When in the halls of the classroom and dormitory, please be quiet and courteous to others. Do not run or make loud noises in the hallways.
10. **Internet:** There are internet connections on campus and in the dormitories for your use.
11. After using the **bathroom and shower**, please clean up after yourself. Make sure you have everything you came in with. Girls, do not throw sanitary napkins or tampons in the toilet. Wrap used items in tissue and throw them in the wastebasket.
12. **Dorm kitchens:** There is a microwave and hot water dispenser for your use. When using the kitchen facilities, please clean up after yourself by washing and cleaning anything you use. You may not cook any meat in the kitchen. If you use the kitchen and do not leave it clean, it will be closed to everyone.
13. **Laundry:** There are washers and dryers for your use and no charge. You are responsible for your own laundry detergent (soap). If you want to hang your clothes to dry, please do so in your room. For your protection, we require you to wash your sheets at least once a week.
14. **There will be a bedroom check every night at 10:30**, so please be in your bedroom before that time. After this check, you need to stay in your room unless you have to use the bathroom. You may not sleep in a room other than the one you are assigned to be in.
15. **Girls and boys may not enter each other's dormitory at any time.** Students may not be alone in certain areas of the campus, including the beach, without adult supervision. ECI encourages healthy emotional

relationships; however, if staff observes couples engaging in inappropriate physical activity, students will be given a warning.

16. **Overnight/Weekend Leaves:** Any off-campus leaves must be arranged for and approved one week prior to the date. Sometimes you may be invited to a friend or relative's home for a weekend. A permission slip is available in each of the dormitory Deans' offices that must be filled out and approved by ECI and the Dean before you can leave campus. ECI and the Deans require your host to sign out and sign in the student. As an international student you must provide ECI and MBA the name, address, and phone number of any person you may be with at anytime. In each case, ECI must contact your parents prior to any off-campus arrangements for approval. Drivers must show they have a valid driver's license, registered vehicle, adequate insurance and be over the age of 25. You may not go off campus at any other time unless you are escorted by an ECI or MBA staff member.
17. **Chapel and Sabbath:** Each evening Sunday through Thursday at 8 p.m. in the each dorm's chapel there will be a brief devotional. **FRIDAY NIGHTS WHEN THE SUN GOES DOWN UNTIL SATURDAY NIGHT WHEN THE SUN GOES DOWN**, you are to be very quiet and respectful in the school. This is a time of reflection and rest for the school – this is the Sabbath day.
18. **Dress Code:** No jewelry in the dormitory or school property. You may wear jewelry off campus.
19. Your clothing must be appropriate for a religious school. MBA and ECI staff will ask anyone with inappropriate clothing to change. Students may dress casually to attend classes within certain limits. Jeans, shorts, and t-shirts are acceptable. Pants and shorts must not hang more than two inches below the navel, nor be more than seven inches above the knee. T-shirts may not contain inappropriate language or images. Students who dress inappropriately for class will be asked to return to the dorm to change.
20. In the **cafeteria** please help yourself. Please do not take more food than you can eat. If you put it on your plate you should eat it.
21. **Each Saturday and Sunday**, you will have the opportunity to go off-campus with all the ECI students for activities and shopping.
22. **Seatbelts:** It is California State law that you wear a seatbelt – over the shoulder across your chest and across your lap. If stopped by a Highway Patrol and you are not wearing your seatbelt – both you and the driver are ticketed with an expensive fine. Now the fine is \$271. You are responsible for your fine and the driver's fine if he is cited because you

were not wearing your seat belt. The driver still must go to a traffic court even if you pay the fine. **All passengers must wear seatbelts.**

23. **Travel:** Do not make any travel plans or reservations before talking to an ECI staff member or you will be charged for any transportation you require if not approved by ECI staff.

**If you are traveling overseas, be sure to have your I-20 signed by Dean Julie George or you will not be allowed back in to the USA.**

24. ECI is happy to transport you at no charge. But you also must be respectful of the cost and time it takes ECI to provide this service. If ECI is transporting you, **YOU MUST BE PACKED AND READY AT THE CURB AT THE DESIGNATED TIME THE ECI STAFF HAS ASKED YOU TO BE READY.** We often have several students departing at close times from the same airport/bus facility – **IF YOU ARE LATE, YOU MAY CAUSE SOMEONE TO MISS THEIR FLIGHT OR YOU MAY MISS YOUR OWN FLIGHT.** We cannot predict the traffic situation which is why we allow enough time to get you there safely. If you are not ready for departure, ECI may have to leave without you and you will have to arrange to get to your departure destination on your own. **If ECI has to wait for you because you are not ready you will be charged the hourly rate of the employee that must wait.**

25. **Luggage:** ECI will transport you and two bags at no charge. We ask that you be respectful of the limits of space and the safety of other students when shopping. If you cannot hold your purchases on your lap, do not buy it. You can arrange to have

anything shipped to MBA directly: Your name, Girl's Dorm or Boy's Dorm, Monterey Bay Academy, 782 San Andreas Road, La Selva Beach, CA 95076.

ECI staff is here to assist you whenever needed. Please do not hesitate to contact us at any time.
